



Advice after hysterosalpingogram

You have had a hysterosalpingogram (investigation of your uterus and fallopian tubes).

You were referred by

During the examination we gave you an injection of an iodine-based solution called Omnipaque. This allowed us to see your uterus and fallopian tubes.

Is there anything I should look out for?

This solution has passed through your uterus and into your fallopian tubes so that these organs can be seen. Omnipaque is a colourless solution but it is very sticky and will come out the same way it went in. You will be given a sanitary towel to leave with, but you may want to have a bath or shower when you get home.

Mild pelvic pain, discomfort and 'spotting' is occasionally felt up to a couple of days after the procedure. If this persists, gets worse or an unpleasant discharge is noticed then please contact us on the number below during working hours (Monday - Friday 9am - 5pm). Outside of these hours please contact your GP.

When will I get my results?

You will get the results the next time you see the doctor who referred you (see above). If you do not already have an appointment one will be sent to you.
