### What is Palliative Care?

Palliative care recognises the special needs of people living with life limiting disease. Care focuses on comfort and quality of life. We aim to promote personal dignity and independence, respecting cultural and religious practices. Support is available for families and carers.

The Community Palliative Care Service team includes doctors, nurses, family support team, physiotherapists and occupational therapists. The team works closely with your General Practitioner, your hospital team, the community nurses and other community services to ensure you receive optimum care.

# Where services are provided?

- Outpatient assessments
- In hospital
- In your home
- · Hospice.

Referrals made to Salisbury Palliative Care Service can be made by your GP or your Medical Specialist. The service aims to help people stay at home and avoid unnecessary admissions to hospital.

If you are finding things difficult or there is a crisis we can talk you through the available options.

We offer specialist support to assist with:

- Assessment and management of troublesome symptoms like pain, nausea and anxiety
- Practical care needs
- Advice on and coordination of equipment required at home
- Advice on specialist medications and information about management and side effects
- Accessing nursing support at home provided by community nurses
- Emotional support for patients, families and care givers
- Changing health needs
- Facilitation of smooth transition between hospital, home and other community services
- Information about loss and grief
- Future care planning
- Information about financial support
- Other health care professionals involved in your care.
