Trust Values and Behaviours

We will constantly seek to improve and transform the way we work, to ensure that our services respond to the changing needs of our communities.

All prospective new staff will be assessed against these values to ensure we are recruiting quality candidates.

Introduction to Department

This is an exciting time for our Trust as it is the first time that we are recruiting Physician Associates (PAs) to join our Medical Directorate.

We are looking for 4 highly motivated qualified Physician Associates to work in either the Emergency Department (ED) or the Acute Medical Unit (AMU).

THE ROLE OF THE PHYSICIAN ASSOCIATE

Successful applicants will work with the junior medical team in either the Emergency Department (ED) or on the Acute Medical Unit (AMU).

They will undergo an induction programme and be supported and mentored in the development of their clinical practice. They will be allocated a consultant educational supervisor to support them to develop a professional portfolio and will be offered CPD, study leave support, and teaching time. In addition to working as part of a multi-disciplinary team, they will have the opportunity to become involved in audit/research, teaching and simulation training.

DUTIES OF THE POST

- Conducting ward rounds with the team, assessing and examining patients and facilitating clinical plans under the supervision of doctors
- Clerking of patients to include assessing and examining, as well as ordering appropriate investigations, interpreting investigation results and recommending treatment accordingly.
- To establish differential diagnosis, making appropriate treatment plans
- Record or dictate the history and physical condition and ensure accurate and comprehensive medical records are maintained using appropriate written and electronic documentation according to Trust guidelines.
- Initiation of basic/advanced life support in patients
- To be actively involved in patient care, liaising with staff and other members of the clinical team as required.
- To participate in multi-disciplinary meetings including departmental teaching and governance.
- To treat patients and family members with a high degree of empathy and to use advanced communication skills
- To show excellent communication skills when updating other health professionals
- Ensure that patient care is of a high standard at all times and that standards of care and treatment meet the department's requirements.
- To conduct audits and quality improvement projects.
- To keep up to date with latest developments and engage in an appraisal
- To carry out procedures which will include;
 ECG, venepuncture, IV cannulation, arterial Blood Gas sampling and analysis, urinary catheterisation, suturing, NG tube placement, injections,

lumbar punctures, diagnostic and therapeutic abdominal paracentesis, pleural procedures

Training and Educational Supervision

There will be a PA teaching programme arranged for the entire group of Trust PAs. Each PA will have a dedicated supervisor for the year and take part in continuing professional development to ensure post-holders are up to date with new guidelines. The Trust hosts PA students from Bournemouth University and PAs will be expected to assist with teaching them when on placement throughout the year.

In addition, PAs are expected to:

- attend external and internal meetings where they will be expected to contribute to potential improvements in services.
- To develop local clinical guidelines within their specialist area as required
- Adhere to agreed Trust wide guidelines and care pathways;
- · Adhere to the principles of evidence-based practice;
- Be expected to produce timely and correct discharge summary and general correspondence to third parties such as primary care;
- Support and implement patient safety initiatives that are required of the Trust;
- To record all untoward outcomes and complications of treatment;
- To ensure compliance with the Trust's reporting system and incident forms;
- · Attend clinical governance half days;
- · Apply patient safety systems adopted by the Trust.

Preceptorship

A one year Preceptorship is offered to all newly qualified PAs which is split between ED and AMU (6 months each). A specific Preceptorship can be discussed upon appointment.

- Evidence of relevant ongoing personal and professional development
