## Items for Escalation to Board

Items for escalation from the October 2018 Clinical Governance Committee:

- 1) Positive assurance an update on the achievements of the national maternity patient survey improvement actions. The survey results were some of the best in the country.
- 2) Positive assurance improvements in end of life care as an outcome of personalised care planning, education and support for patients and families from specialist nurses.
- 3) Funding the Hospice in 19/20 will receive £140K less from the Hospice charity. Issue to be formally raised with Wiltshire Clinical Commissioning Group.
- 4) As predicted the number of pressure ulcers reported has increased as an outcome of the new national guidance categories.
- 5) Prostate cancer pathway improvement actions planned to reduce the number of 104 and 62 day cancer referral to treatment time breaches.
